Course Objectives

The primary purpose of this course is to introduce the basics of presenting scientific research. The course will cover the following topics:

- Abstracts, i.e. executive summary of a paper.
- The science pitch, i.e. "elevator" talk.
- Long talks.
- Project reports.
- Science literature search resources.
- Graduate school and employment.
- Science and engineering teams.
- Science ethics and professionalism.

Course Materials

There is no textbook. The instructor will provide training documents.

Evaluations

You will receive a grade of "G" for the first semester of the senior thesis course, which will then be converted to a final grade after completion of the thesis in the second semester. Your final grade for the course will be determined by your research advisor with input from the instructor. This grade is based on the quality of your research, effort, midyear report and talk, senior thesis and defense talk, and participation in the PHYS 451/452 or 495/496 courses. An informal grade will be provided at the end of the semester, as well as guidance on the trajectory of the research.

Thesis and defense (2^{nd} semester): These written and oral presentations are the primary means of evaluating your work.

Research effort: Your weekly productivity and effort on your thesis project are essential components of your course performance.

Midyear report and talk: These written and oral presentations provide guidance on your research performance and can complement evaluations in the second semester.

Short talks and abstracts (I^{st} and 2^{nd} semesters): These short oral and written presentations will occur at the start of each semester.

Course participation: In class participation is required.

CAUTION

- PHYS 451 and 452 (or PHYS 495 and 496) are required for graduation as a Physics major.
- Two semesters of PHYS 451/452 or one semester of PHYS 495/496) will satisfy the COLL 400 requirement. You need three credits of COLL 400 to graduate.
